**ACTIVE DRUG INGREDIENT**

Each kilogram contains feed grade zinc bacitracin equivalent to 150 grams of bacitracin (1 gram bacitracin is equivalent to 42,000 International Units).

**MIXING DIRECTIONS**

ALBAC G Feed Supplement should be premixed with 10-20 kg of feed and then thoroughly mixed with the bulk feed.

**WARNING:** May cause an allergic skin reaction.

**PRECAUTIONS:** Avoid breathing dust. Contaminated work clothing should not be allowed out of the workplace. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse. Wear protective gloves, clothing and face protection.

**STORAGE:** Store below 30°C (Room Temperature) in a dry place. Close container securely after use.

**DISPOSAL:** Shake and empty containers into medicated feed. Do not dispose of undiluted chemicals on-site. Puncture or shred and bury empty container below 500 mm in a disposal pit specifically marked and set up for the purpose, clear of waterways, vegetation and roots. Empty bag and left-over product should not be burnt.

**FIRST AID: IF ON SKIN:** Wash with plenty of soap and water. If skin irritation or rash occurs, seek medical advice/attention.

Broiler Chickens	0.33	(50)	As an aid in prevention of necrotic enteritis caused by or complicated by <i>Clostridium</i> spp. or other organisms susceptible to zinc bacitracin,
	1.33	(200)	As an aid in treatment of necrotic enteritis caused by or complicated by <i>Clostridium</i> spp. or other organisms susceptible to zinc bacitracin. CAUTION: To control a necrotic enteritis outbreak, start medication at the first clinical signs of disease. Administer continuously for 5-7 days or as long as clinical signs persist and then reduce medication to preventative level (0.33 kg ALBAC/tonne feed).
Quail	1.33	(200)	For the prevention of ulcerative enteritis in growing quail due to <i>Clostridium colinum</i> susceptible to zinc bacitracin. Feed continuously as the sole ration.
Pregnant Sows	1.65	(250)	For control of bacterial enteritis caused by <i>Clostridium perfringens</i> in suckling piglets when fed to sows from 14 days before through to 21 days after farrowing on premises with a history of clostridial scours. CAUTION: Diagnosis should be confirmed by a veterinarian when results are not satisfactory. Feed containing an approved level of zinc bacitracin should be the sole ration.

Indiscriminate use may increase the risk of the development of antibiotic resistance. Duration of use should be limited to risk periods when possible.
